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## Wines of the Month

Alexander Valley, home to some of the best wines in California, has the right soil and climate to produce outstanding Sauvignon

Blancs—like the 2007

Sauvignon Blanc from

Souverain, our first Wine of the Month. Winemaker Ed Killian has a knack of turning out great wines for a modest price. His recently released '07 Sauvignon Blanc puts that talent on display. Flavors of fig, lemon, citrus and melon are superb on the palate. Outstanding balance of fruit and gentle barrel aging produces a wonderful rich freshness and lively finish.

Souverain Sauvignon Blanc is a perfect summer sipper! Value priced at only \$11.98.

The 2008 Domaine Massiac Viognier is a breath of summer from the South of France. The wine comes from Domaine Massiac, a tiny estate within the Minervois appellation of the Languedoc. The property is set back just off the Mediterranean Sea, right where

the French coastline ends. From this remote and rugged locale, Domaine Massiac has been producing wine since the 16th century.

You might expect a Viognier grown this far south in France to lose its spine in a soft



cushion of overblown opulence. Not so at Massiac! Monsieur Boudouresques, the proprietor, does a masterful job of maintaining a fresh acidity in his Viognier and captures a crisp minerality that seems to tap directly into the region's craggy limestone hills. All of this is presented in a wine that finishes truly dry. The result is an ideal summertime beverage—a taut, composed wine that smacks of white peach fruit and wet stone, displays nuances of flowers and cool green herbs, and energizes the palate. This wine is surprisingly versatile at the table. Serve well-chilled. Domaine Massiac Viognier is another awe-

some summer sipper at \$11.98 net!

Roussillon is one of the oldest viticultural areas of France. In fact, the Romans made wine here. And it's here that we find Domaine LaFage and winemaker Jean-Marc LaFage. Though only in his thirties, Jean-Marc is already one of the most sought-after winemakers in Europe. He lends his expertise with Southern European varietals to several top estates throughout France and Spain (He's the principal winemaker for Las Rocas Garnacha, for example.) But his best work is done at home in the hills of Roussillon, where he makes terrific wines like **Domaine** 

> LaFage Cote Sud (2006) with his wife Eliane, also an accomplished winemaker.

Our featured wine is made from 60% Syrah, 30% Grenache Noir, and 10% Cabernet Sauvignon. The Syrah is from 30 year-old vines and the Cabernet is from 20 year-old vines. On

the palate this medium-weight wine has lush forward fruit with flavors of cherries and blackberries. Rich and complex with pepper and spice flavors on an amazing finish. Domaine LaFage Cote Sud is a lot of wine for \$8.98.



Deep, bold, brooding and complex, the 2007 Hahn Estates Meritage Central Coast begins with a rich and full aroma, followed by a heightened level of intensity compared to Malbec and 9% Cabernet Franc. The generous

recent vintages. The Bordeaux-style varietal blend is 31% Merlot, 31% Cabernet Sauvignon, 17% Petite Verdot, with 12% percentage of Petit Verdot and Malbec adds tantalizing depth to the overall taste profile. It also deepens the color in the glass and enhances the layers of richness in the midpalate. Our Wine of the Month has a full spectrum of red-to-black fruit aromas with notes of cassis, spice and cedary oak. In the mouth loads of plumy, black cherry, blueberry, and cassis flavors, soft tannins and a lasting finish. \$11.98.

**I.Terrazas Cabernet (2007), Argentina:** A deep maroon color followed by aromas of black currant, blackberry fruit and spice. An intense Cabernet with rich and complex flavors of red fruit and spice. \$9.98.

#### 2. Chateau de Pennautier 'Cabardes' Languedoc, France:

Both Bordeaux and Rhone varietals must be included in the Cabardes appellation. The resultant blend is wonderfully complex with great fruit intensity and good structure. \$9.98.

#### 3. Bodegas Ortiz 'Dacu', Ribera del Guadina (2007), Spain:

This warm and inviting red wine has tons of fruit and ripe flavors that dominate the palate. Black currant, the main fruit flavor, takes on a whole new role in this appealing medium-bodied red. \$7.98.

#### 4. Quattro Mani Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, Italy (2007):

Quattro Mani (translates to "four hands") showcases the joint effort of four superstar Italian winemakers in Abruzzo. Penetrating black-cherry fruit flavors on the palate in this light, easy-drinking wine. \$9.98.

**5.Villa Cafaggio Chianti Classico (2006), Italy:** Here is a very supple, easy-to-drink Chianti with a huge nose of cherries and blackberries. A stylish medium-bodied wine with lush flavors of cherry fruit and vanilla along with a smooth, velvety finish. Only \$16.98. (Regularly \$24.99.)

**6. Folie a Deux Menage a Trois Rouge (2006), California:** Amazing what happens when you blend Zinfandel with Merlot and

Cabernet Sauvignon. Spicy and soft, this forward-drinking wine is a perfect companion for your barbecue. \$8.98.

#### 7. Charles Smith 'Boom-Boom' Syrah, Washington State:

Get your barbecue season off to a great start with this savory wine from the Columbia Valley. This bold red is focused on ripe blackberry flavors but caresses the palate with its gentle, smooth texture and long, lingering finish. Just twist the cap and serve! \$15.98.

**8. Vina Indomita Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon (2006), Maipo Valley, Chile:** Made from 100% Cabernet Sauvignon grapes, Indomita Cabernet offers pure cherry and zesty blackberry flavors presented very elegantly and with just a modest oak influence. \$12.98.

#### 9. Feudi di San Gregorio Falanghina (2007), Campania, Italy:

This white wine is all about freshness and cut. Produced in Campania in southern Italy, the Falanghina shows bright citrusy flavors and has plenty of lush fruit at mid-palate. This youthful wine possesses a great underlying minerality and wonderfully brisk acidity. Perfect with grilled seafood and poultry dishes. \$14.98.

**10. Domaine de Bel Air Pouilly Fume (2006), France:** Domaine Bel Air dates back to the 19th century. This 12-hectare estate adheres to the principle of "lute raisonne," or minimal intervention. The wine rests sur lie for six months after fermentation. It shows a wonderful minerality and smokiness that we love in Pouilly Fume. Offered at super price this summer of only \$16.98.

France: Vincent Girardin just keeps making customer friendly white Burgundies at reasonable prices. His Emotion de Terroirs 2006 displays all the elegance of a much more expensive Burgundy. Long flavors of tropical fruit mix with mineral hints of oak, yielding a delicate feel on the palate. This wine smells—and even tastes—like a Puligny Montrachet because it includes grapes from Girardin's overproduction of his village wines. \$26.99.

Le Fils des Gras Moutons Muscadet (2007), Loire, France: This is a medium-bodied, mineral-laden Muscadet produced by Claude Branger and his son. The wine is crisp and lively, without being overly acidic. Juicy, clean style with a dry citrus-clean finish. Great by itself, a perfect summer sipper. \$13.99.

Beringer Alluvium Blanc (2007), Knight's Valley California: A very flavorful white wine comprised almost entirely of Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon grapes that were-barrel fermented in French oak. The nutty and toasty aromas, combined with the textural element from the oak, lends a lush backdrop to the wine's refreshing citrus flavors of lemonlime, apricot and melon. \$18.99.






## Macrostie Chardonnay, Carneros (2006): This summer we suggest you


